### ON PUBLIC POLICY (January 2015) By Pat Strott-Wheatley

This month, we will first discuss the issues and bills of interest to the goals of AAUW on the National level. As we all know there was a bit of a turnover in the elections and now both the House and the Senate are controlled by the Republicans. That may make it harder to find compromises, but some of our representatives and Senators have pledged to try to work together more effectively. The second section will discuss what is going on in the State of Maryland mostly as tracked by MLAW, the Maryland Legislative Agenda for Women

#### **NATIONAL**

Together they keep everything before our eyes to pass on to the membership so that we can act on what we each feel concerned about.

Each month Deborah Swerdlow sets up a nationwide policy conference call. This past month more than 80 Public Policy Chairs took part in it. The main topic was about how and when to set up meetings with our elected officials if we want. Many resources are available to help us at: www.aauw.org. (How to structure the meeting, voters guides, etc.) Deborah stressed the best times of the year to attempt such meetings: Jan. 29 (the anniversary of the Lilly Ledbetter Act); Feb.16-20 (Presidents' Day Recess); Feb. 23-27 (Week stressing Higher Education); April 14 (Equal Pay Day). For assistance from National Office, fill out the AAUW upcoming policy events form http://bit.lv/UpcomingPolicvEvents. On this form we can request free material and staff support. And then we can let National know how the meeting went! http://bil.ly/AAUWEvent Form . This gives our branch an opportunity to "toot our own horn" a little! Also of National concern; keep an eye on the proposed EDUCATION BILL and use the "2 minute activist" to register any concerns.

"The MLAW (Maryland Legislative Agenda for Women) Board of Directors reviewed the results of the December balloting and identified the issues that will comprise the **MLAW Legislative Agenda 2015.** Our branch is a member of MLAW. (See the description of MLAW on P. 1-2 in the Presidents' column. The issues selected are listed below and described in more detail on pages 2 and 3 of our December branch newsletter. Also these issues are described in detail on the MLAW website.

- Midwife Licensure
- Protective Orders Relief for Victims of Dating and Sexual Violence
  - Akins Law
- Domestic Violence –Protective Orders Additional Relief
- Maryland Earned Sick and Safe Leave Act
- State Personnel Limits of Use for Leave for Birth, Adoption, Foster Placement, or Care of Child
  - Paid Family and Medical Leave –
     Feasibility Study
