On Public Policy By Pat Strott-Wheatley

Hello again from the Public Policy team. (There are three of us now, myself, Roxann King, and Cheryl Menke --- we would love a few more to join us in our efforts at political activism).

This month will be brief, as I only want to bring a few things to mind. As I noted at the March general meeting, April has been designated EQUAL PAY MONTH by AAUW, and April 14th is EQUAL PAY DAY. At the meeting I distributed booklets with the history and statistics concerning this very basic and important concept for women and their families. I was listening to CNN the other day, and they did a segment on this since it is coming up on April 14. The commentator pointed out that although we have an equal pay law and the Lily Ledbetter Act calling for equal pay for equal work (signed by President Obama his first week in office!), this country still is out of compliance and has not achieved pay equity. The commentator said that it would take about another 45 years to catch up at the rate we are going! At this time the, national

difference is \$.78 (women) to \$1.00 (men). Fortunately, we reside in the best area of the country for catching up on equality in wages. DC has the best ratio, and the state of Maryland, the second best (\$.87 to \$1.00). Please try to notify one of our senators (Barbara Michalski or Ben Cardin) or our congressional representative (Donna Edwards) and urge their continued support on this issue. Thank you from all the women who will benefit!!

To stay informed of the important bills before the House and Senate, please make sure you register with "AAUW National" to be a "2 Minute Activist". They will send you alerts and notifications when Congress is in session. And for ALL of us in this Branch, Dot Gibson and I have worked out a plan to share what important information I receive as Public Policy Chairman. I will send information to Dot and, as the person in charge of the Newsletter and communications, she will forward it to the membership!

So happy spring to all! And now that it is finally beginning to warm up, perhaps we will all have a little more s-p-r-i-n-q in our step!
