As we move into the "active" part of the year (Collecting for our annual book sale, planning for our various meeting, planning how to wisely distribute the money we raise, and of course how to get together for a little fun!) be assured that the PUBLIC POLICY part of AAUW is roaring ahead too!

Since it is an interim election year, we will of course want to make our voices heard with opinions on that! So, as we have done in previous election years, we will be co-sponsoring an "Election Forum" in October, with the League of Women Voters, and The Council of Jewish Women of Anne Arundel County.

Each of the three groups will have certain tasks to be responsible for so that the meeting itself runs seamlessly and with order in all exchanges. A flyer is coming out announcing the date (Monday evening, Oct. 13), the place (Kneseth Israel Synagogue on Spa Road), and of course, the participants (those running for County Executive, George Johnson and Steven Schuh). Our responsibilities, besides some funding, will be providing bottles of water for all, manning the front door and seating people, time keeping, carrying questions... We will need 8-10 AAUW volunteers. Feel free to submit yourself to myself, Cheryl

Menke, or Mary McGrath. It should be enlightening AND fun! It always is.

The above is the most local we can be involved in political and public decision making. But of course there is also State of Maryland issues (as covered in the organization MLAW) and all the many Federal concerns we want, and need, to stay informed of. With National issues, it is really easy to make your voice heard! On the Home page of the National AAUW website, you just sign into "The Two Minute Activist" give YOUR opinion and send it to your senators (who you can locate by your zip code!). So, each month we will take on one or two of the important things going on; let you all know of conferences, demonstrations, and meetings of interest to women and families and thus try to keep us all on our toes as we try to stay informed and to influence the tomorrows ahead of us and our children!

Of course I mustn't end this month without sharing what happened the first week the Congress returned from their August break. They ACTUALLY discussed three important things that have been on the agenda for a while: 1) They debated a constitutional amendment to enact campaign reform (long overdue, and no decisions were made); 2) they talked about the Paycheck Fairness Act (long, long, and overdue) and 3) They passed a bill to fund the government through December. What is referred to a "kicking the can down the road"! What they didn't even attempt was raising the minimum wage, refinancing of student loans, immigration reform, and several other things that need updated and reformed! They don't return again until mid-November for the final days of the 113th Congress.

So we will all keep our eyes on the balls that should be juggling in the rarified air of Capitol Hill!

Legal Advocacy Fund

The Legal Advocacy Fund (LAF) works to challenge sex discrimination in higher education and the workplace. Their resources range from community outreach programs to backing of major cases.

Sex discrimination today takes a variety of forms: unfair pay, pregnancy discrimination, sexual harassment, sexual assault, and violations of Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 can affect both women and men. LAF addresses these barriers by informing people of their rights and using the legal system to seek justice and change.

One of the many cases that LAF is currently supporting is: Cioca vs Rumfeld. Kori Cioca always knew she wanted to join the military. As soon as she was eligible, she joined the Coast Guard. She thrived there, until one of her superiors began harassing her. After her complaints about the harassment fell on deaf ears, he escalated his behavior, assaulting her and breaking her jaw and later raping her. Kori eventually left the military, traumatized, wounded, and betrayed. When Kori found out that about 20 percent of women and 1 percent of men in the military are sexually assaulted, she decided to join the lawsuit Cioca v. Rumsfeld to help change that bleak reality. She and dozens of other military member survivors of sexual violence allege that the failure of the Department of Defense to act on the issue of sexual assault in the military amounts to a violation of their constitutional rights. AAUW proudly supports these plaintiffs and their case.
