EOF/LAF REPORT

Several AAUW state conferences held this spring will feature presentations by LAF-supported plaintiffs, advocates and experts. Perhaps it would be a good idea to suggest to our state branch to pursue such a presentation at our state convention next year. National offers grants for this purpose and branches can apply for funds to offset the expenses through the case-support travel grant. This year's deadline for applications is October 30th. Supreme Court Follow-up of Hobby Lobby Case-

LAF currently is monitoring Zubik v. Burwell, a follow-up case to Burwell v. Hobby Lobby, a decision which acknowledges the right of some corporations' right to not provide insurance coverage to women for contraception. In this new case, attempts are being made to further limit women's rights to contraception. AAUW feels that the oral arguments presented in the case suggest that the court will seek an alternative method to ensure that women will have access to health care. LAF Express will keep you up-to-date on developments.
