With about 600 or more boxes left after the sale, this extra effort can really benefit our educational grants. So keep this in mind and start recruiting friends and family now. Last year we had 30 or more members and volunteers helping: it was real teamwork. In preparation for the 2016 Maryland legislative session volunteer for this important committee. there are three women-centered events scheduled:

- The MLAW Fall Conference will be held on Saturday, November 14, 9:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m. in Gaithersburg. Bills being proposed this year will be presented to the group for consideration of sponsorship by MLAW (Maryland Legislative Agenda for Women). Later in the fall the MLAW members vote on which bills will be supported. I will be attending and would love company on the drive to Gaithersburg.
- Late January 2016 Maryland Women's Legislative Briefing host sessions led by teams working to draft legislation to address various women's issues in Maryland. The participants get to share ideas with those crafting the bills. This is very interesting and attended by many of our legislators.
- 3) Early February MLAW Legislative reception in Annapolis. Meet with the legislators to discuss the bills being supported by MLAW this year.
