- Transfer Scholarship awards to Anne Arundel Community College graduates transferring to a college or university;
- AAUW Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF) awards, presented by the national AAUW organization to women for graduate education or research related to women's issues.

You can also specify your donation towards scholarships to the annual **National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL)**, held annually at University of Maryland in College, College Park. We annually fund participation by one or more student leaders from our local colleges.

Public Policy Update By Roxann King

Elections Milestones: In 2017, there will be <u>21</u> <u>women</u> serving in the U.S. Senate — the highest number in history. The chamber will also feature a record number of women of color. Senators-elect Tammy Duckworth (D-IL), Catherine Cortez Masto (D-NV), and Kamala Harris (D-CA) will be the first Thai American, first Latina, and first biracial woman, respectively, to serve in the U.S. Senate. They will join Sen. Mazie Hirono (D-HI), the chamber's first Asian-American member, thereby quadrupling the number of women of color in the Senate.

There are twenty AAUW-supported issues currently posted there that could use your immediate support, including Campaign Finance Reform, Banning Salary History requirements for job applicants, support for Title IX... You may not agree with every issue, but your support counts for those you endorse. AAUW members sent tens of thousands of messages of support to federal and state legislators through the AAUW Action Network in 2016. AAUW is currently taking a stand against the hate crimes that are pervasive following the elections. The Action Network online and the Lobby Corps visits to congressional offices, in addition to occasional testimony in front of congressional committees, are the tools used by AAUW to promote issues.

Issues supported by AAUW are proposed by members (deadline was December 5) and voted on bi-annually online during the **AAUW National Convention**. The convention will be held this year in Washington, D.C., on June 14-17. Registration has already opened with the best value available through January 14. Click here for details: <u>http://convention.aauw.org/</u>. Conventions are activism-oriented and great learning experiences. Our branch funds attendance by the presidents.

The Maryland Legislative Agenda for Women is still in the process of selecting the bills that it will support in the Maryland 2017 legislative session. As soon as these are known and a date set for the MLAW Legislative Reception in Annapolis, we will share this information with you. Several attendees at the Holiday Luncheon (Lee Harper, Maggie Cullman and Karen Roth) indicated that they would like to attend hearings on bills. At the advocacy training session in October, MLAW indicated that this is the most powerful way to encourage the success of bills. We did well: our profit will exceed \$11,000 after all expenses. The exact amount should be available for the February newsletter. Books remaining from the sale were purchased by Wonder Books in Frederick and by Curmudgeon, a new book store in the Marley Station mall. About \$2000 supports branch activities for the next year, but the rest goes entirely to our three educational funds.

We acknowledge the support of members of our families and the community in making the sale successful. Fedder Management Corporation of Owings Mills, Maryland, donated the site again for the seventh year. (They have been very good to us!) The Bank of America on Jumpers Hole Road in Severna Park, the YMCA of Greater Annapolis in Arnold, and St. Philip's Episcopal Church on Bestgate Road in Annapolis allowed our collections at their locations, which turned out to be the biggest ever. Members Lucia Robson, Jeanne Hawn, Michele Hauf and Maggie Cullman allowed use of their garages for book storage. Cindy Neseth maintained the book sale Facebook page and contacted book dealers through BookFinders.com for the public pre-sale on Thursday morning. Kathy Arias posted our publicity in the local newspapers. Thousands of books were presorted during July through October by members Terry Saylor, Barbara Marder, Stacey Hilder, Sam Hackman, Jeanne Hawn, Pat Block and Cindy Neseth. And the list goes on....parade participants, sorters, sale volunteers and the cleanup crew. Thank you one and all, and your family members and friends, who worked to make this sale a success.


