Here we are at the end of another productive and enjoyable year in AAUW! We've enjoyed serving as your Anne Arundel Branch presidents for the 2016-17 year. As we look back on our year together with you, we are encouraged that our Branch is accomplishing things we value and pursue as our mission in AAUW.

Our Branch started the year hosting the State AAUW training for leaders in July. Several new members of our Board attended. All summer, members collected books on Saturday mornings for the annual Fall book sale. In September, the Branch hosted the membership luncheon for new and current members. At that time, we set out our goals and plans for the year. In April several members attended the AAUW State convention to meet the current leaders and participate in workshops on current legislation pending for women in Maryland, which is regularly monitored and supported through our Public Policy group. Thanks to the work of our Historian and others, the Anne Arundel Branch was wellrepresented and highly visible as a force within the State, in the past as well as the present and future. The AAUW Annual membership dues are due now for the year from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018. The dues for most people are \$70. Dues breakdown: AAUW National - \$59, Maryland State - \$10, and branch - \$11. Life members pay State and Branch dues.

You can go online and pay by credit card at www.aauw.org by clicking on the 'Membership' button at the top of the page. Then click on the 'Renew' button. You can create an account by entering your membership ID (found on the label of AAUW correspondence) and a password. You will be able to update your address, phone, and email address as well as pay your dues. If you don't know your membership ID, email Dianne Dezio (dcdezio@gmail.com) and she will send it to you.

Also the May luncheon is an ideal time to pay your dues if you pay by check.

PUBLIC POLICY By Roxann King

Vote! Every vote counts!

Voting has already begun for the AAUW national public policy program issues for the next two years. On the back of your spring 2017 issue of Outlook magazine (which arrived last week) you can find your member ID and voter PIN. Read the issues. found in the special election supplement at the back of the Outlook magazine, and then go to aauw.org and VOTE! Voting is online. (You can also use the personal link sent to you through email.) Exceptions are expected: if you do not have internet access, contact the national office at 800-326-2289. Two years ago, only 1 out of every eight members voted and they determined the policies that AAUW supported actively during the two years that followed. Every vote counts! National public policy is decided every two years with the voting ending during the national convention (June 14-17, Washington D.C. this year). During the preceding fall, members had the opportunity, through our presidents, to recommend policy changes.

National Public Policy:

This month, April, is Sexual Assault Awareness Month. AAUW is the only organization policing college policies continuously relative to Title IX. AAUW has found that sexual assault occurs more frequently when schools fail to have a Title IX coordinator, or a Title IX coordinator with proper training. AAUW Action Network has materials available for you to deliver to local college and university Title IX coordinators. Get details at www.aauw.org/resource/titleixdelivery/

Results of MD legislative actions for 2017:

Two of MLAW's (Maryland Legislative Agenda for Women) priority bills passed the general assembly during this legislative session. Both bills have taken several years of advocacy and revision to achieve success. HB 001, Maryland Healthy Working Families Act, will require employers with 15 or more employees to provide earned paid sick and safe leave; with 14 or fewer employees, to provide unpaid sick and safe leave; and with tipped employees, to provide paid minimum wage for sick and safe leave.

HB 429, Criminal Law, Sexual Offenses, Physical Resistance, establishes that evidence of physical

resistance is no longer required in Maryland as proof that a sexual offense has occurred. Supporters of MLAW will be gathering at Union Jacks in Annapolis on Tuesday, May 2, from 6:30-8:30 p.m. to celebrate the successful legislative session. AAUW Maryland's 75th Anniversary Celebration

The 75th Anniversary of AAUW Maryland was celebrated during the annual state convention in Easton and St. Michaels, April 7-8. On April 7 a celebratory dinner was held at the Miles River Yacht Club in St. Michael's. The program featured interviews with all prior state presidents who were able to attend. Our own member, Lynn Hapchuk, who was state president from 1997-1999, spoke about the most important goals and issues during her presidency.

On Saturday, the featured speakers included national board chair of AAUW, Patricia Fae Ho, and Maryland's first woman and first African-American Adjutant General of the Maryland National Guard, Major General Linda L. Singh. Patricia Ho focused on activism and emphasized that AAUW's new CEO comes to us from the Brookings Institute with experience in promotion of public policy. Major Singh spoke of how she became who she is and urged us: "Think about what you are on this earth to do. You are in this group (AAUW) for a reason." Several of our members actively helped plan the events: member Markonette Richardson, as co-vice

president for Programs, and member, Terry Sayler, as co-historian, who put together a video commemorating the 75 years. Pictures for the video were supplied by former State President Dian Belanger.
