### **BOOK SALE COMMITTEE**

### We need your help!

The only fundraiser for our AAUW Branch is the used book sale. It starts in July with the Severna Park 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade where, this year, we gave out 2500 bookmarks to inform people of where and when we will be collecting books. On July 22, we had our first (and very successful collection) of used books. Collections take place between 10 am and 1:00 pm on six Saturday mornings at the Bank of America on Benfield and Jumper's Hole Rd, at the YMCA on Ritchie Highway in Arnold, and at St Philips Episcopal Church on Bestgate Rd across from Medical Parkway. There will be three more collections – September 9<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, and October 14<sup>th</sup>.

### How can you make a difference?

Every time we have a collection, we need at least 3 people at each location to greet those donating books, move the books they are offering into our own cars, and then transport those books to our storage garages as the cars are filled up. At each garage, we need at least 1, but preferable 2 people to receive the books and start sorting. Then we have 2 people who travel from site to site and help out where needed. That is a total of 15 people every time we have a collection. It is easy to sign up and help out. Please use the link below and put your name by a job, at a location and on a date that fits your schedule.

<u>Collectors</u> – arrive at 9:45am and stay until 1:15pm. <u>Sorters</u> – Arrive at the storage garages between 10 and 10:30am on collection days. As the books are brought from the collection sites, the sorters weed out books we cannot sell or that we do not want to sell. The rest are packed into boxes, so they can be stacked and stored in the storage garage until it is sale time.

<u>Estate Sale packers</u> – Another source of books are those left over after an estate or yard sale. A special email is sent to the membership asking people to bring boxes and come help us pack up the books. We can always use 4 or 5 people, but sometimes we will need more.
