#### **AAUW USED BOOK SALE**

On Friday October 27<sup>th</sup>, we moved tables, books and supplies into our storefront at <u>8159-B Ritchie Highway</u>. This is a different storefront than previous years, but in the same shopping center as before. Since then we have been sorting, setting up, and getting ready for a successful sale.

Member Family and Friends night is Wednesday, November 1<sup>st</sup>, from 6:30 to 9pm. Bring your family and friends and be prepared to shop your heart out. Wine, cider, water and sodas will be served.

On Thursday November 2<sup>nd</sup>, the sale officially kicks off, with book dealers paying to have the first choice of all the books we have collected. We need a lot of hands on deck to keep the sale organized and work the checkout line. At 10 am the sale opens to the public and runs through Sunday November 5<sup>th</sup>.

The sale ends on Sunday, November 5<sup>th</sup> with bag day. Shoppers fill a bag with books and pay a set fee based on the size of the bag they have filled. At 3 pm, the sale closes and we go to work packing up all the books that are left, loading them into trucks we have rented, breaking down the tables, and cleaning out the storefront. We need all hands on deck for this job! This is also a good time to bring kids and grandkids to help carry the boxes we pack.

REMEMBER -This is our **BIG** fundraiser, and the proceeds fund our scholarship program. The Maryland Legislative Agenda for Women (MLAW) is holding its fall conference at Howard Community College on November 18<sup>th</sup>. In the afternoon, there is training for effective advocacy or lobbying. Our branch and AAUW Maryland are members of MLAW.
