It is exciting to report that at the end of our first three collections and many donations to individual members, we have filled one of our storage units with about 1100 boxes of books and Jeanne Hawn's garage is about three quarters full. The community is coming out in great numbers to donate their books to our cause, which is wonderful, but also means there is lots of work to do before we open our sale to the public.

During the next month, we will continue to receive donations from individuals and hold another collection from 10 to 1 on Saturday October 20th. In the meantime, there are always books to go through and pack, so we can stack and store them. You can help at Jeanne's or at the storage unit. Contact Linda King, Barb Marder, Terry Sayler, Jeanne Hawn or Cindy Neseth and they will meet you and set you up.

On Friday, November 2, we will be moving into the storefront, 8159B Ritchie Highway, in Festival at Pasadena, starting at 9:00 am

We need help:

- 1. A volunteer to meet the movers at the storage unit and let them into the facility;
- 2. Volunteers to help set up the tables, organize the book categories and then start sorting and arranging the books on the tables;
- 3. Volunteers with trucks or SUVs to move the books from Jeanne Hawn's, 457 Bendale Rd, to the sale site. Doing this ourselves will help to keep our costs as low as possible.

November 2 through November 7, we will be unpacking all those books we have, been so carefully packing into boxes for three months. Only now, we will be sorting them into categories and setting them on tables to help all those who come to the sale find the books they want.

<u>Wednesday, November 7</u>, will be MEMBERS', FAMILY AND FRIENDS' NIGHT. This is the time when we come together to celebrate all our hard work and to show our friends and family what a wonderful opportunity our book sale offers those who love books. We get to be the

first to look over and buy those books we didn't know we wanted as well as those we have been looking for forever.

<u>Thursday</u>, <u>November 8</u>, from 8 to 10 am is Dealer Day when book dealers actually pay for the privilege of looking over and buying our books. We will need 8 to 10 volunteers to handle the crowd.

At 10 am, the SALE OPENS to the public. During the next 4 days we will be working to keep our sale site organized, neat and well stocked.

Sunday, November 11 is BAG Day, which means the crowds will once again descend upon our sale and gobble up bags of books in order to get the most they can for the least amount of money. At 3 pm, we close the doors and begin the cleanup. Signs are taken down, U-Haul trucks are picked up and brought to the site. All left over books are packed into boxes and loaded into the trucks. Husbands, fathers, boyfriends, sons and grandsons. are welcome and encouraged to come and lend a strong back and a willing hand. Cardboard is broken down and taken to the recycling centers. Supplies are repacked and tables folded up.

On Monday, volunteers drive the U-Haul trucks to the wholesaler in Frederick; the tables are picked up, and the storefront is swept and cleaned. We will then turn out the lights, return the keys and begin to think about next year. But right now, plan on being there as much as you can because you do not want to miss a minute of the fun and excitement!!

Volunteers are needed for the Candidate Forums!

At least eight volunteers are needed at each of the four candidate forums being held between October 9th and October 17th and which we co-sponsor with the League of Women Voters and the National Coalition of 100 Black Women. All of Anne Arundel County legislative districts are included except for District 21, which overlaps a large area around Laurel in Prince Georges County. All candidates for Maryland Senate and House of Delegates have been invited to participate in the forum for their district. Forums are being held on October 9th for Districts 31A and 31B at Chesapeake Arts Center, 196 Hammond's Lane, Brooklyn Park; on October 10th for Districts 30A and 30B at Kneseth Israel, 1125 Spa Road, Annapolis; on October 11th, for District 33 at Woods Memorial Presbyterian Church, Severna Park; and on October 17th, for District 32 at Ark and Dove Presbyterian Church, 8424 Piney Orchard Pkwy, Odenton.

If you are unsure of your district, click here for a map. Please try to attend the forum for your district and ask for your AAUW name tag when you arrive.

The forums flyer is included in the newsletter. **Please copy and post as many flyers as you can** in your libraries, grocery stores, churches, fitness centers or anywhere that people congregate. Publicizing the events is part of our responsibility.

MLAW registration is open for the Saturday, November 17th conference at Notre Dame of Maryland University from 8:30 – 4:30. Registration and details are at https://mdlegagendaforwomen.org/. The registration fee for the morning session is \$45 (\$30 for students). The afternoon advocacy session is free. All the advocacy groups proposing bills for the upcoming 2019 legislative session introduce their bills at the morning meeting. Afterwards, in December, MLAW members vote to decide which bills to support. Bills are chosen also by their likelihood of success. Last year, four of the seven bills

supported by the groups in MLAW became law. (Details of the last session are on the MLAW website above.)

Finally, make sure you attend the October 8th Branch meeting at Woods Church at 7 p.m. Our public policy committee has provided the guest speaker, Wesley Queen, director of the Legacy Program at University of Maryland which trains Marylanders, often retired, for volunteer positions in legislative offices during the Maryland General Assembly Session.

AAUW is **NOT** a political organization

Our organization promotes educational equity and workplace equity for women and girls, and families. Every bi-annual convention year, members have an opportunity to suggest policy changes or issues for the national AAUW to support. All members then have an opportunity to vote whether or not to support the recommendations. If supported, operational changes are made and newly adopted policies will be targeted by AAUW national and state lobbying efforts. Not all members support all policies, but those supported by the national organization are the result of a consensus of the membership.

Since we are not a political body, we do not endorse any candidates. At the present time, several of our members are running for public office. While the Branch cannot publicly endorse any of these candidates, individual members are certainly welcome to host events. The branch email, newsletter, website and social media pages cannot be used to promote any such events or the candidates. Once elected, however, public officials can be invited for meeting presentations and participation in our events. Branch funds cannot be used to support other non-profit organizations. Branch funds are used for our Branch activities and to support national AAUW grants and activities, such as the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL).

The national AAUW does award educational grants to both individuals and organizations annually. These provide one of the largest financial resources for research on women's issues in higher education. This year \$3.9 million in grants were awarded by AAUW to support 250 women and non-profits improving the lives of women and girls.
