It has been a VERY SUCCESSFUL collection due to the work of a lot of committed members, especially the packers and sorters who worked many hours beyond the collection times to process the many books donated to our cause. Thank you especially to Jeanne Hawn, Barb Marder, Cindy Neseth, Terry Sayler, Janice Holmes and Stacey Hilder for the extra hours and work they have done and continue to do.

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 2nd is the set-up of the sale at 8159-B Ritchie Highway, in the Festival at Pasadena Shopping Center. Members will start at 9:00 am, setting up the tables and sorting books into categories. We have hired a company to move the books from EZStorage to the sale site. However, in order to keep costs down, we are looking for volunteers with trucks, SUVs , trailers and strong backs to move the books from Jeanne's garage to the storefront. Dave Hilder will be organizing that process. Set up will begin on Friday, Nov 2nd, and continue until Wednesday, Nov 7th. We will need all members to give as many hours as they can to get all of the work done. There will be a sign up sheet available on SignupGenius that breaks the day into 3 hour shifts, but feel free to come for more than 3 hours if you can or, if that is too much, come for an hour or two. Signups help us plan the day, but if you find yourself available on a day you have not signed up for come anyway for as long as you can.. Spouses, friends and potential AAUW members are also welcome

October was a busy month for public Policy. At the October 8th Branch meeting, Wes Queen explained the Legacy Leadership Program run by University of Maryland for retired Marylanders. The program prepares volunteers to work during the 90-day Maryland General Assembly session.

Branch members co-sponsored three candidate forums with the League of Women Voters of Anne Arundel County: in Annapolis on October 10th; in Severna Park on October 11th; and in Odenton on October 17th. There were some glitches due to candidates not being able to attend. The forum planned for October 9th had to be cancelled; House of Delegates candidates were not able to attend the Annapolis forum; and the Senate candidates could not participate in the Odenton forum. Nevertheless the three forums held were well received with good attendance. We wish to thank all Branch members who helped with the forums.

The AAUW Maryland Public Policy Vice President, Erin Prangley, is holding conference calls on the first Monday of each month to prepare for the Maryland General Assembly session. Thank you, Joan Spring, for representing us in the October call. Two proposed bills supported by AAUW Maryland were discussed: the patient bill of rights and extending child support to include education beyond high school.

We are looking forward to representing our Branch at the Maryland Legislative Agenda for Women fall conference on Saturday, November 17 from 9:30 am to 4:30 pm at Notre Dame of Maryland University in Baltimore. Hello, my name is Alexandra Radovic and I am the Editorin-Chief of the Campus Current newspaper at Anne Arundel Community College in Maryland. I had the great pleasure of attending the NCCWSL conference at the University of Maryland this past June. Upon entering the

conference, I was thrilled to be surrounded by empowered and fascinating female college leaders, like myself. Many amazing speakers shared a universal message of female leadership and the struggles women in the workforce overcome to achieve equity. I was able to share experiences with women from across the nation, studying everything from business, to engineering, to education. As an editor for a newspaper, I work in a profession that is predominantly male, which is something I was delighted to share with the women I met. The NCCWSL is an extraordinarily influential and vital group of strong willed women who combine their powers to set a new tone for a changing world, and I strongly encourage any girl who is sitting in class to raise her hand and run for class president. - AAUW Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF) awards, presented by the national AAUW organization to women for graduate education or research related to women's issues.


